Learning Objectives	The objective of the course is: to provide students a good understanding of the basic concepts of comparative law and its methodologies; to introduce them to the study of legal traditions and illustrate the debate on the contraposition between common law and civil law.

	The course consists of lectures held by the lecturer and it's is characterized by a broad involvement of students due to a constant interaction and moments dedicated to sharing the main themes taught.

Applying knowledge and understanding on:	The student will know distinguish the common law legal system from the civil law system. The course will enable the student to compare the rules that govern societies, and that in Western experience, are guaranteed by the State, taking into consideration sources of binding rules different from written law. The student will learn that a correct comparison must contemplate other formants, as case law and/or legal literature. The student will know that on internal law must be replaced by sensitivity to legal transplants and the perception of the factors that lead to the circulation of legal models.

Assessment and feedback	
Methods of assessment	ORAL EXAMINATION
Evaluation criteria	Students must reproduce the descriptive and argumentative lines learnt in the lectures and from the textbook. The interview is aimed at testing the students' knowledge of the subjects studied and their understanding. The assessment process aims to verify the students' degree of knowledge of the institutions, their ability to make comparative assessments of what has been learned and their ability to exemplify and re-elaborate the contents acquired. The evaluation will take place in thirty from 18 to 30. An exam is deemed to be passed successfully if the final grade is equal to or higher than 18/30
Criteria for assessment and attribution of the final mark	Students must show the knowledge of the descriptive and argumentative lines learnt in the lectures and from the textbook. The interview is aimed at testing: -the students' knowledge of the subjects studied (features of the common law legal system and of the civil law system; influences of the EU Law system) and their understanding; -to verify the students' degree of knowledge of the topic debated during the lecturers; -to verify their ability to exemplify and re-elaborate the contents acquired.
