Teaching strategie	Teaching is organized through lectures and seminar activities, aimed at examining specific topics, using official texts and documents.
Expected learning outcomes in terms of	The course aims to provide knowledge of the main legal norms of the international organizations, also through the analysis of regulatory sources and jurisprudential cases.
Knowledge and understanding on:	Students will know the content of the law applicable to international organizations.
Applying knowledge and understanding on:	Students will be able to read and use international documentation.
Soft skills	At the end of the teaching students will be able to understand and use the international documentation, developing a critical thinking on the issues addressed.

	At the end of the teaching students will be able to develop theoretical and practical skills in written and oral communication, in order to adapt the communicative register to the peculiarities of the international legal system. At the end of the teaching students will be able to apply the learning methodologies acquired, to define the regulatory framework applicable to the international community, in order to autonomously deepen their knowledge.

Content knowledge	Origins, evolution and characteristics of international organizations. Composition, structure and functioning of international organizations. The legal personality and responsibility of international organizations. Immunity and privileges of international organizations and their officials. The acts of international organizations. The financing of international organizations and their budget. Dispute resolution and international organizations.
Texts and readings	Textbook: P. Pennetta, S. Cafaro, A. Di Stasi, I. Ingravallo, G. Martino, C. Novi, Diritto delle organizzazioni internazionali, Assago, CEDAM, 2023, II edn. (chapters I-VIII; and two chapters chosen from among the other chapters: IX to XIV).

Assessment criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Knowledge and understanding</i> The level of analysis of the topics covered by the program will be evaluated. • <i>Applying knowledge and understanding</i> Students will have to demonstrate that they have acquired the skills to evaluate the impact of international legal rules devoted to the functioning of international organizations. • <i>Autonomy of judgment</i> At the end of the teaching the student must have developed the ability to critically apply international law rules. • <i>Communication skills</i> It is necessary that the student develops a good ability to communicate with specialized technical language in order to verify the achievement of the learning outcomes indicated in the previous points. • <i>Capacities to continue learning</i> The assessment is about learning how international institutional law can be used in the world of the legal professions in the era of globalisation.
Final exam and grading criteria	The final evaluation will be expressed with a mark out of thirty. The oral exam will focus on the knowledge of international institutional law. The exam will not be passed if the sufficiency is not reached. The grade will be assigned on the basis of the argumentative ability matured and the ability to make connections between the various topics addressed.
