Prerequisites/requirements	
	The student will have to show a good knowledge of the specific topics of the course and she/he will have to be aware of them. More specifically the student will be asked: Know the fundamental principles of national, EU and international law on immigration and protection of foreigners. Identify, recognize and interpret the legal issues related to the entry and the residence of foreigners in Italy as well as their expulsion.

Contents	The regulations of immigration and the legal status of foreigners between national, EU and internazional law will be examined, with a focus on its sources and its historical evolution.
