Knowledge and understanding:

Expected learning outcomes (according to Dublin Descriptors)

Comprehension of basic economic concepts, allowing to understand the functioning of markets, the behavior of economic agents, and the characteristics of the main macroeconomic variables.

Applying knowledge and understanding:

By the end of the course, students will improve their ability to learn basic economic concepts, will have greater awareness on economic dynamics and will be able to draft first policy advices according to theories studied over the year. They will acquire the necessary basis to undertake a more in-depth study of other economic subjects foreseen in their curricula.
