Syllabus	
<b>Learning Objectives</b>	<i>This subject aims at allowing students to learn French language grammar from a morphological, syntactic and lexical level. These objectives will be reached through an immersive linguistic work during lessons. In addition to the grammatical part of this subject, this course would attract students' attention to allow them to reflect on present-day French, European and international events.</i>
<b>Course prerequisites</b>	<i>Any</i>
<b>Contents</b>	<i>This teaching activity will deal with present-day political and cultural events concerning contemporary France. Contents will be aimed at a knowledge of French language from two points of view: its linguistic dimension and its institutional and political one. This activity will be divided into two parts: an analysis about the institutions of the 5<sup>th</sup> French Republic and about the present-day political and administrative French context, and a part concerning linguistic analysis. In the first part, principles of French Republic will be presented, as well as the main institutions of the 5<sup>th</sup> French Republic, and contemporary French political context. The second part will be about the study of French grammar, in particular its phonetics, accents, morphology and syntax.</i>
