Syllabus	
Content knowledge	<p>The teaching activity named French language and translation will concern political, economic, social and cultural contemporary France. It is aimed at a knowledge of French language from two aspects: a linguistic dimension and a geopolitical, economic and cultural one.</p> <p>This teaching activity is divided into two parts strictly connected:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Lectures about French political institution of the 5th Republic and political and administrative French context; 2. A grammatical part consisting in explanations and exercises. <p>In particular,</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. the first part will concern <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Principles of French Republic; - The main institutions of the 5th Republic; - French political contemporary context starting from 2022 presidential elections. <p>Some main historical periods will be presented with also laws dealing with the creation of contemporary French institutions. This will be allowed through the analysis of written and multimedial original documents;</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. the second part will concern the study of French grammar starting from its elementary structures, namely: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Phonetics, accents and orthographic markers - Articles - Nouns - Adjectives (all categories) - Pronouns (all categories) - Numbers - All verbal tenses - Gallicisms

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The passive and the reflexive forms - Verbal constructions and impersonal constructions - Presentatives - Affirmative, negative and interrogative sentence - Prepositions and adverbs - The simple sentence - The complex sentence.

Assessment	
Assessment methods	<p>Assessment methods will consist of a written and an oral exam.</p> <p>The first part of the exam is the written one and is composed of grammatical exercises to complete, functional to the B1 level of language competence. It lasts 50 minutes and the total number of questions is 60. Any dictionary or glossary may be used. Final mark is expressed on 30.</p> <p>The second part is the oral one (after having passed the written exam). It consists in reading and translating a press article and in answering to at least three questions dealt with all the topics regarding this teaching activity.</p> <p>It may be possible for students to pass 2 <i>in itinere</i> written parts before the main exam session about topics only dealt with lectures, namely grammar and content topics. These parts are not compulsory and may be replaced by the final written exam.</p> <p>In any case, the final evaluation is the result of the written and the oral parts.</p>
