Learning Objectives	The Spanish language course, divided over the first three levels of the “Common European Framework of Reference for Languages” (A1 basic introductory level; A2 basic intermediate language; B1 threshold level), aims to help students acquire the language skills through a communicative method and the development of four ‘abilities’: reading, listening, writing, speaking.
Prerequisites	<p>Good command of written and spoken Italian. Knowledge of a foreign language acquired in upper secondary school.</p> <p>Knowledge of Spanish is not required for absolute beginners (A1).</p> <p><u>In order to reach the A2 level</u> students must have passed level A1 in previous years or have a summary knowledge of the language (junior high school) or possess a level A1 language certification.</p> <p><u>In order to reach the B1 level</u> students must have studied Spanish in high school for at least 3 years or have previously passed Laboratorio di spagnolo A2 or have attended a language course for Erasmus students in a Spanish university (a certification will be required) or possess an A2 language certification.</p>
Expected learning outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Knowledge and understanding:</i> <u>Levels A1-A2:</u> the course aims to provide basic knowledge of the phonetic, orthographic and grammatical structures of the Spanish language. <u>Level B1:</u> review and consolidation of basic morpho-syntactic and grammatical structures of the Spanish language. Lexical and syntactic expansion. Development of self-learning techniques. • <i>Applied knowledge and understanding:</i> On completion of this module, students will have acquired the morpho-syntactic structures of the Spanish language and the comprehension skills of a Spanish text, written or spoken, of increasing

	<p>difficulty according to the course's level. Students will have also developed the ability to exchange information (increasingly elaborate, according to the course's level) with an interlocutor in a daily context.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Making informed judgements and choices:</i> Students will be required to evaluate and employ the methods acquired in oral and written communication. • <i>Communication skills:</i> The exercises for the consolidation of the Spanish grammar, calibrated according to each student's starting level, the use of the four abilities and the students' active participation (role play, oral activities, writing and listening exercises) will lead to a correct use of the oral and written Spanish language according to the requested level. • <i>Learning ability:</i> The skills acquired reinforce the development of a learning ability and a progression in the knowledge of the language and ability to listen, speak and write.
<p>Evaluation criteria</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Knowledge and understanding:</i> <u>Levels A1-A2:</u> Basic knowledge of the phonetic, spelling and grammatical structures of the Spanish language and the mastery of vocabulary related to situations examined in class. <u>Level B1:</u> Consolidation of the basic morpho-syntactic and grammatical structures of the Spanish language and the mastery of an adequate lexical background; development of effective self-learning techniques and the level of understanding of written texts. • <i>Applied knowledge and understanding skills:</i> The student's ability to decode a written and oral text and to exchange information (increasingly processed according to the level required) with an interlocutor in the everyday context, in written and oral form, will be verified. • <i>Autonomy of judgment:</i> The ability to evaluate and use the methods acquired in written and oral communication will be verified, depending on the level required. • <i>Communication skills:</i> Through specific exercises, calibrated according to the level of knowledge required, the use of the four skills will be assessed. • <i>Ability to learn:</i> The ability to apply the acquired methods to topics and contexts not covered in the lesson will be assessed.

Teaching methods	<p>The Language Workshop avails itself of the collaboration of expert mother-tongue Language Assistants and is organized in courses of different language levels (A1, A2 and B1) regardless of the year of course.</p> <p>Depending on the teaching levels (A1, A2 and B1), the course includes: exercises related to the study of grammar and phonetics, reading of articles, scripts and anthological passages, written production of short summaries and original texts, and development of self-learning skills.</p>		
Assessment methods	<p>Oral and/or written examination.</p> <p>1) For students attending (i.e. who have attended at least two thirds of the lessons): the Laboratory does not provide for a specific examination but a written verification at the end of the course relating to the acquisition of grammatical knowledge, structured on the model of the exercises carried out in class.</p> <p>In order to obtain suitability it is necessary to have attended at least two thirds of the lessons and to have passed the test. Students who are not suitable at the end of the course (or who are unable to take the test on</p>		

	<p>the scheduled date) will be able to repeat the test on the entire program by enrolling in the exams for non-attendants in June, September and January (see page esse3 Laboratorio di Spagnolo).</p> <p>2) For students who are not attending the lessons or students who have to take the exams: there will be two tests (one written test, on the whole program, and one oral test). Eligibility tests are scheduled in June, September and January.</p> <p>All notices about dates and modalities of the tests are published on the Department's website at the link: https://www.uniba.it/corsi/lettere/studiare/laboratori</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The examination timetable is published on the site of the Degree Course and on Esse3. - To register for the examination, usage of the Esse3 system is mandatory.
