Learning Objectives	Through an in-depth knowledge of a specific topic of Spanish Literature, also in relation to the European context, students will be led along a research path, making them compare on the one hand with the texts, on the other hand with a specialized critical bibliography, routing them to the research work.	
Prerequisites	Advanced knowledge of the history and features of Italian literature and of the main features of at least one European literature. Knowledge of methodologies of literary analysis, meter and figures of speech. Knowledge of European history. Knowledge of the Spanish language is not required, but attendance of the Spanish language course is strongly recommended to those who did not study Spanish in high school or at university.	
Expected learning outcomes	 Knowledge and understanding: On completion of this module, students must have acquired: thorough knowledge of the work of one or more authors (also in relation to the history of the texts' tradition and their variants) and of the literary genres of a given era, with particular attention to the history of theatre; command of philological and analytical methodologies of a literary text; ability to place texts in their historical and cultural context, in Spain and in Europe, having also studied their critical bibliography. Applying knowledge and understanding: On completion of this module, students must possess: high comprehension skills of literary languages thanks to the application of analytical methodologies and critical exercise applied to the texts studied; 	

	 ability to contextualize literary phenomena, also through the comparison between research hypotheses and different methodologies to apply to the texts taken into account. ability to connect the literary texts studied with other texts and other artistic codes (art, cinema, music) Making informed judgements and choices: the methodological consideration accompanying the reading of the literary texts and critical bibliographies contributes to the development of critical awareness, which is a precondition for making independent, informed judgements. In particular, students will learn to analyze the discourses and ideological assumptions lying behind literary texts. Communicating knowledge and understanding: the study of literary texts allows students to attain an elaborate specialised vocabulary; the acquisition of analytical tools helps express complex concepts. The Master's Degree graduate's essential abilities will be a mature level of expression and clear and effective argumentation. Learning ability: the abilities acquired will give students the chance to develop their learning ability, also strengthened by confrontations with the teacher and colleagues. Working at the laboratory also gives the chance to test one's analytical skills, even applied to research

Course contents	Memory and invention: the poetic work of Luis de Góngora. Analysis of texts by the Cordovese poet (an anthology of sonnets, romances and letrillas; the Polyphemus and the Soledad primera) aimed at illustrating the evolution of his poetics, the links with the Greek-Latin, Italian and Spanish traditions, the invention of a poetic language renewed with respect to the Petrarchist roots. The course also includes reflections dedicated to the seventeenth-century literary controversy around Góngora and its twentieth-century fortune.
