Assessment	
Assessment methods	Written and/or oral testing during and at the end of the course.
Assessment criteria	In order to assess the student's level of knowledge and understanding, the acquisition and/or consolidation, depending on the level, of the morpho-syntactic, phonological and grammatical structures of the French language will be examined, as well as the degree of development of listening, pronunciation and production skills, both oral and written in French. For the assessment of the level of Autonomy of Judgement, the ability acquired by the student to apply the self-learning techniques developed during the courses will be taken into account. For the assessment of the Communication Skills level, the student's ability to argue will be taken into account. For the assessment of the Ability to Learn level, the student's oral production capacity will be taken into account, depending on the level, and the acquisition of the communication techniques studied in class.
Final exam and grading criteria	The measurement of learning and the awarding of the final grade will be based on assiduous attendance of exercises, in-progress tests and the aptitude test to be held at the end of the course.
Further information	The French Language Workshops are taught by a native speaker language teacher (Maria Pecchia; maria.pecchia@uniba.it). Students are divided into four levels (introductif, intermédiaire, seuil, avancé) in accordance with their knowledge of the language. In the second half of September, before the courses begin, students are required to register. Information on how to register will be published at least two weeks before the courses begin on the DIRIUM website and on notices posted on the notice board outside the "French language and literature" - Room n. 39, 1st floor, palazzo Ateneo). Registration will be closed once the maximum number of students per course has been reached. Students attending courses will be required to pass an end-of-course test for which they must register on Esse3; information regarding the date of the test will be provided by the language teachers towards the end of the course.



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Students must register for the exam using the Esse3 system.
