privatization processes, in particular port and airport regulations, thus stimulating an understanding of the current dynamics of the market and the local reality. This stimulates independent judgment and a critical approach.

Communicating knowledge and understanding

At the end of the course, the student will have acquired the legal vocabulary necessary to face and cover job positions in the transport sector, in particular in the public sector, as well as in the private sector to provide advice on concrete issues, through the analysis of the regulatory framework.
