Expected learning outcomes	<p><i>Knowledge and understanding</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Knowledge of the main theories of personality and most common personality tests, which are framed within a biopsychosocial perspective. <p><i>Applying knowledge and understanding</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Use of personality tests and questionnaires. <p><i>Making informed judgements and choices</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ability to synthesize the risks related to the use of personality tests. <p><i>Communicating knowledge and understanding</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Communicating through a personal style and a proper terminology what has been learned during the course.

	<p><i>Capacities to continue learning</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Understanding, analysis and processing of texts concerning personality tests, in order to expand one's knowledge autonomously.
