Expected learning outcomes	<p>Knowledge and understanding - knowledge of the different approaches to the study of development and of the main stages of the social- affective and cognitive development in individuals. Applying knowledge and understanding - recognising the adequacy or inadequacy, depending on the age, of the individual's behaviour in the different contexts of daily life. Making informed judgements and choices - observing and scientifically analysing the individual's behaviours in the different contexts of daily life. Communicating knowledge and understanding - Communicating through a personal style and a proper terminology what one has learned during the course. Capacities to continue learning - Understanding, analysing, processing, and talking of texts about developmental psychology, in order to expand one's knowledge autonomously.</p>
Contents	The course aims to introduce the students to the main developmental psychology topics: - Nature of child development - Methods for the study of human

	development - Development theory - Perception and motor development - Cognitive development - Language development - Affective and emotional development - Social development - Moral development - Contexts of development (family, peers, school, society). Special attention will be paid to the questions related to the attachment bonds established during a lifespan.
