<b>Course prerequisites</b>	Knowledge of the main historical events from the 19th to the 21st

Contents	The aim of the lectures is to provide the students with an overview
	of the main events that took place from the second half of the 19th
	century to the most recent historical developments. In particular,
	the module will range: from the events that led to the Cold War and
	the way this impacted on the European states to the rise of new
	extra-European powers; from the Italian unification and the crisis
	of the liberal state to the emergence of dictatorial regimes in the
	20th century; from First to the Second World War; from the Soviet
	Communism to the Fascist regimes; from the return to democracy
	to the construction of a united Europe; from the Globalisation to
	the fight against the religious fundamentalism; from the rise of the
	new Asian powers to the general identity crisis of the West. These
	processes of transition, that also affected Italian history, will be
	scrutinised in their historical, economic and socio-political
	features.

The final grade is awarded by evaluating, in addition to the specific preparation on the contents of the subject, also the ability to understand them, the ability to critically reason around the topics covered, as well as the ability to present the concepts.
