Learning Objectives	Psychopathology and forensic forensic psychology are sciences that deal with the application of all psychiatric and psychological knowledge to law in all its fields and sectors, including work and social security, for evaluation and treatment purposes. Psychodiagnostic tests are indispensable tools and are fully included in the complex of clinical and forensic activities, typical of psychopathology and forensic psychology. The course aims to provide students with adequate and updated training in the use of psychodiagnostic methods, inserted as a necessary complement to clinical, medico-legal, psychological and psychiatric forensic
Course prerequisites	investigations in the workplace and social security Bachelor's degree in Psychological Sciences and Techniques. Beyond this purely formal requirement, basic knowledge of work psychology and organizational behavior psychology are required, in light of the particular and delicate context that characterizes the teaching of forensic psychodiagnostics applied to work contexts. In addition, elementary knowledge of psychometrics, clinical and dynamic psychology are also required, as

The assessment of work suitability, of the social security aspects connected to it, of the risks of work-related stress, of abuse and violence in the workplace, of mandatory issues such as bullying, burnout, the contribution to the institutional analysis of dysfunctional work contexts, often sees psychologists involved as
	professionals . Acquire clinical tools that support assessments in the medical, medical, occupational, psychological and psychiatric fields Master's Degree in Occupational and Organizational Psychology forensics, professionals involved in this delicate area (work) of the existential agenda of people, represents a concrete resource. The correct use of psycho-diagnostic tools applied to work contexts is an unavoidable tool to support assessments that are aimed at the prevention of
	psychosocial risks and violence in the workplace. In fact, it is a question of linking the management of dysfunctional organizational factors that affect individuals (work-related stress assessment and other psychosocial risks) to the prevention of individual conditions of discomfort due to intentional acts (harassment or violence) or reflections due to lack of competence in management work organization (individual stress). The course will offer a broad overview of the main and accredited forensic psycho-diagnostic methods, applied to work contexts, inserting them into a training course in which students will also be able to directly attend assessment courses carried out on workers in this delicate sector of the forensic and labor sector
