Expected learning outcomes	<p><i>Knowledge and understanding:</i> At the end of the course, the students should acquire the linguistic, communicative and cultural elements useful for the achievement of the A2 level of the "Common European Framework of Reference for Languages", developing the ability to understand the essential points of a conversation or a written text on common and familiar topics.</p> <p><i>Applying knowledge and understanding:</i> The students should be able to apply the skills</p>

	<p>acquired during the course, to manage the basic communication on familiar and common topics, using a simple language, to understand a written text using the information in an appropriate manner.</p> <p><i>Making informed judgements and choices:</i> The students should acquire critical skills that enable them to read, analyze and evaluate short texts and to express their opinions briefly.</p> <p><i>Communicating knowledge and understanding:</i> The students should have to acquire the communication skills described for the A2 level of the "Common European Framework of Reference for Languages", demonstrating to be able to communicate on familiar and common topics, to be able to describe in simple terms aspects of their life, and the surrounding environment , to know how to express immediate needs.</p> <p><i>Capacities to continue learning:</i> The students should acquire flexibility in adapting learning styles to different cultural and linguistic contexts, developing their ability to consult bibliographic, iconographic and informatic materials and their ability to autonomously manage the tools for learning knowledge.</p>
Contents	<p>Morphology (40 hours) The specific elements of the Romanian language will be presented, in a descriptive, typological and contrastive perspective, also through the reading, analysis and translation of written texts: phonetics and spelling - the noun - the indefinite article - the article determinative - the declension of the noun - the genitival article - the demonstrative article - the adjective qualifier - the grades of the adjective and comparison - the numerals - the personal pronoun subject - The pronoun of courtesy - the pronoun and the demonstrative adjective - the pronoun and the possessive adjective - The auxiliary verbs - The negative forms of the verb - The indicative mode (present, imperfect, perfect compound, future) - The conjunctive mode (present, past) - The conditional mode (present and past) and the hypothetical period.</p> <p>Language, culture and national identity (20 hours) The historical-cultural elements necessary for the diachronic framework of the Romanian language and culture will be provided in a broader European context, referring in particular to the problem of identity.</p>
