Learning Objectives	<p>The course aims to identify the epistemological statute of the history of education, to bring out the mutual interdependence between education and pedagogy and to clarify its role not only within the educational sciences but also in the relationship with other historical disciplines.</p> <p>The course will also examine some forms of dystopia: dystopia of space, time, social condition, of the soul in an attempt to glimpse ways out or at least to downsize the current complexity from a perspective of Pedagogical Utopia.</p>
Course prerequisites	<p>In the first week of lessons it will be monitored, by interviews, the basic knowledge related to some significant concepts historical-pedagogical and comparative knowledge.</p>

Assessment methods	<i>The final examination will be in oral form, in the scheduled sessions, by reservation in the previous days. The dates for this exam are set throughout the year.</i>

Communicating knowledge and understanding Development of communication skills that allow for discussion of the acquired knowledge in small and large groups. Final exam and grading criteria	<i>The final mark uses a grading scale from 1/30 to a maximum of '30/30 cum laude'. The Minimum passing grade is 18/30. The exam is organized to be in oral mode, the questions will be related to the main topics covered in the lessons and on the main authors of the reference texts, in particular on the student's ability to combine and transversely interpret the acquired knowledge. This method allows the students to acquire efficiently the thought of pedagogues and teachers who have characterized the history of education and who represent a valid example for the training of future teachers.</i>
