- Making informed judgments and choices. The students will have to acquire the capacity to manage critical and personal conclusions in the clinical case's evaluation, with specific reference to the demand analysis's methodology. The course aims to provide the tools to achieve autonomy in making judgment and decisions in the different areas of clinical psychology knowledge and intervention.
- •Communication knowledge and understanding. The students will acquire the ability to communicate knowledge and personal conclusions regarding the evaluation of clinical problems. The students will have to demonstrate expertise in using the subject's specialized language.
- Capacity to continue learning. The course aims to develop learners' abilities to deal with the typical problems of clinical psychology. The students will have to demonstrate the capacity to manage the learned knowledge and understandings in order to facilitate subsequent studies and enhance their autonomy in the clinical psychology field.

Contents

The course consists of three parts, which are characterized by specific training objectives.

The first part will be devoted to the definition of the specific clinical psychology objects, focusing the connection between theory, research and clinical intervention, through the discussion of the different psychotherapy perspectives (psychoanalytic model, cognitive-behavioural model, cognitive-constructivist model, systemic-relational model, transactional analysis model, Gestalt model, body-functional model).

The second part will be devoted to the analysis of clinical psychology as a theoretical knowledge oriented to the study of the implications of early relationships in individual development processes. This part will also explore the study of nowadays family relationships within the plurality of parenting models, with specific reference to the same-sex families. Starting from this topic, the interconnection between the "culture of differences" and sexuality will be analysed.

The third part will be centred on the study of relationship between clinical psychology and psychopathology. This part will include workshops on the *demand analysis methodology* and clinical interview.
