Giuseppe Campesi is senior lecturer and aggregate professor (tenured) in law and Society. Before joining the Dept. of Political Sciences in 2011, Giuseppe Campesi has been postdoctoral research fellow at the University Florence, Jean Monnet Fellow at the Migration Policy Centre of the EUI, and visiting research fellow at the Observatory on Human Rights of the University of Barcelona. His research cut across law, sociology and political sciences, focusing on critical security studies, EU border control and migration policies. Among his main publications on the topic especially worth of mentioning are the two research monographs he has devoted to the comparative historical sociology of immigration detention (2013) and to the origins and functioning of the EU agency Frontex (2015). In recent years he has also embarked upon extensive empirical research on border control practices, being responsible for two main research projects: an observatory on reception policies and immigration detention in Southern Italy, and an socio-legal analysis on the jurisdiction of Italian Justices of the Peace, which are responsible for the judicial validation of immigration detention orders enacted by the police.
