Objectives

The aim of the course is to provide, first, some basic notions of the general theory of law, and, subsequently, to illustrate both the fundamental organisational aspects of public powers, and the mechanisms guaranteeing the rights established by the Italian Constitution and by other major non-constitutional sources. A further, specific objective is to favour the understanding of the interrelations between public institutions and economy, as well as of some topics concerning the application of the economic freedoms.

Course content

In particular, the topics of study will cover: law and social phenomena; law and other sciences; the legal system and public law; public law and private law; the State; forms of State and their historical evolution; forms of government and their historical evolution; the Italian Constitutional History; the State and other systems: the international system, the European system, State-Church relations; sources of law; direct democracy; representative democracy; constitutional bodies; public administration; ordinary, administrative and constitutional justice; Regional governments and local autonomies; fundamental rights; the so-called economic Constitution.
