Workshop location



DIRECTIONS: Once you are in Corso Vittorio Emanuele II, at the beginning of the black arrow in the map below you will see the directions in the picture below which points toward the Old town (strada S. Benedetto). You have to follow the sign "Università degli Studi di Bari" in the picture below
