Conference location

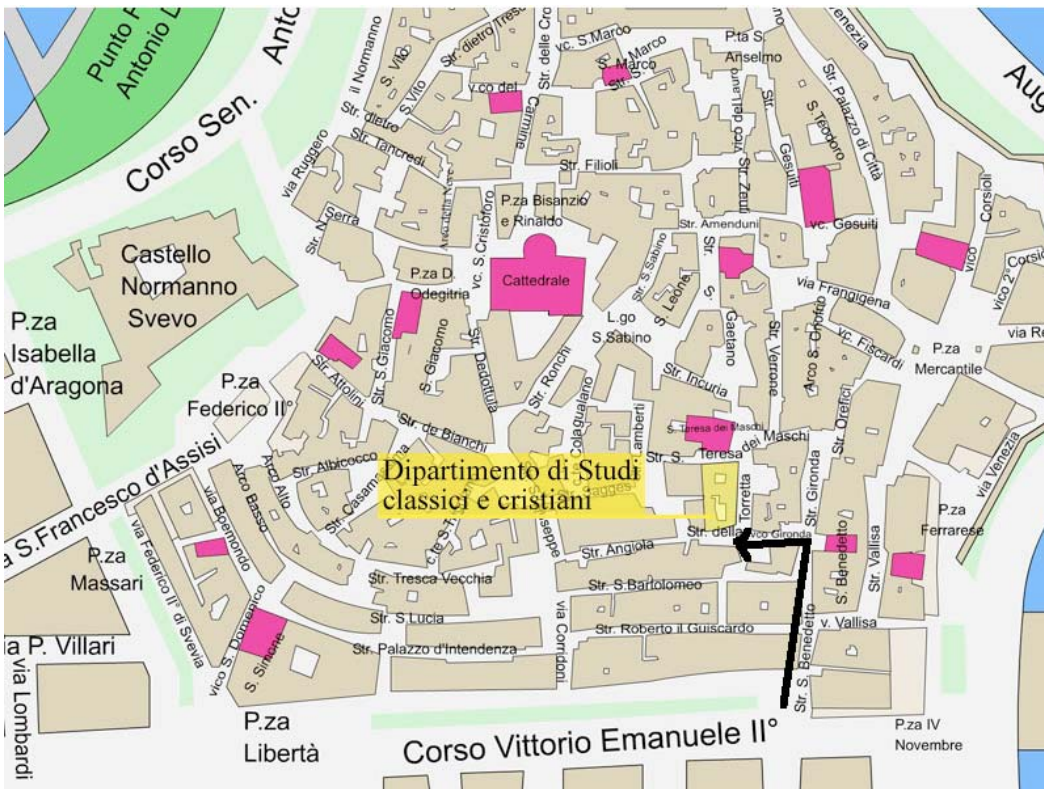
