Conference location

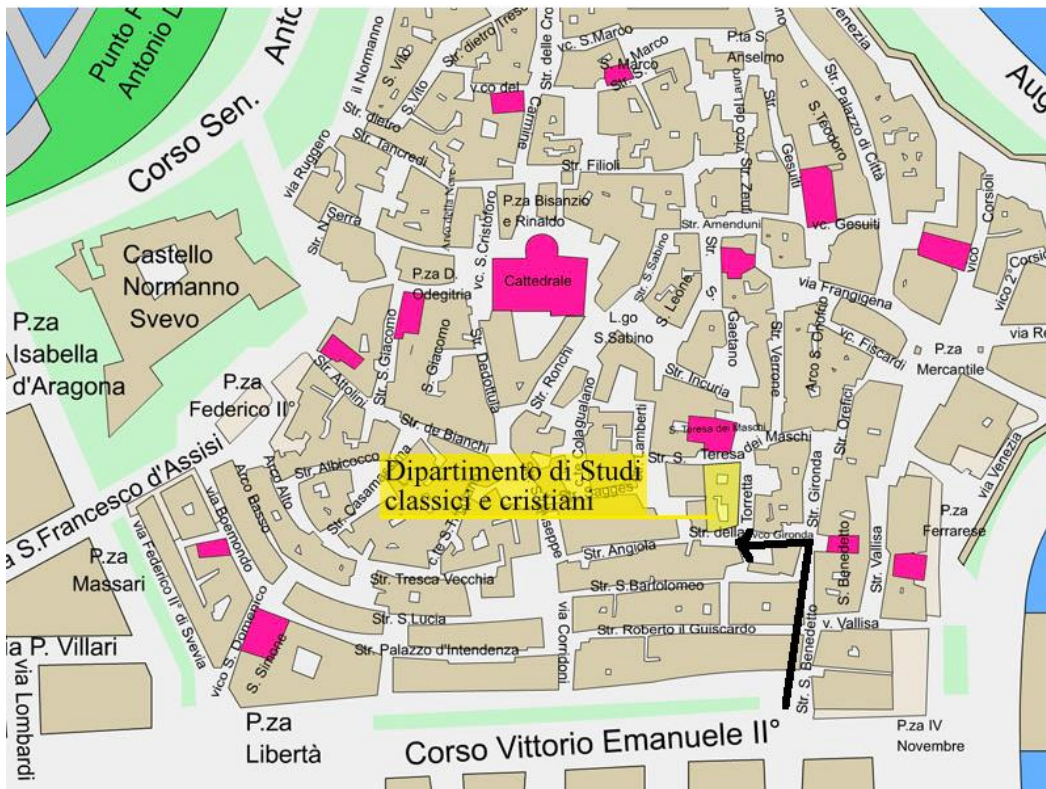
The event will be held in the hearth of the old town (“Barivecchia”), Auditorium Quacquarelli, Dipartimento di Studi Classici e Cristiani, Università degli Studi di Bari “Aldo Moro”. Near the church of “Santa Teresa dei Maschi”, Strada Torretta (Città Vecchia)

DIRECTIONS: Once you are in Corso Vittorio Emanuele II, at the beginning of the black arrow in the map below you will see the directions in the picture below which points toward the Old town (strada S. Benedetto). You have to follow the sign “Università degli Studi di Bari” in the picture below
